Year 8 Science Flower Dissection

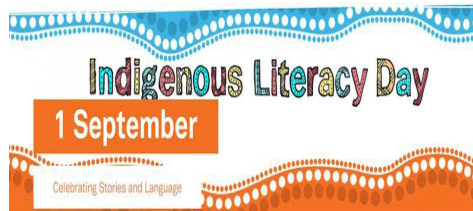

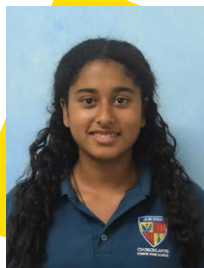

3 Keep learning

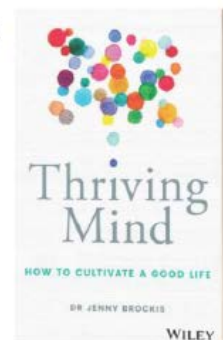
If you know how stress, anxiety, or depression has affected you in the past, what did you learn that you can put into place now?
