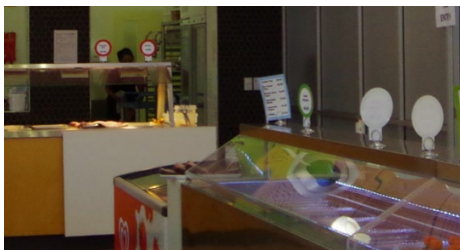

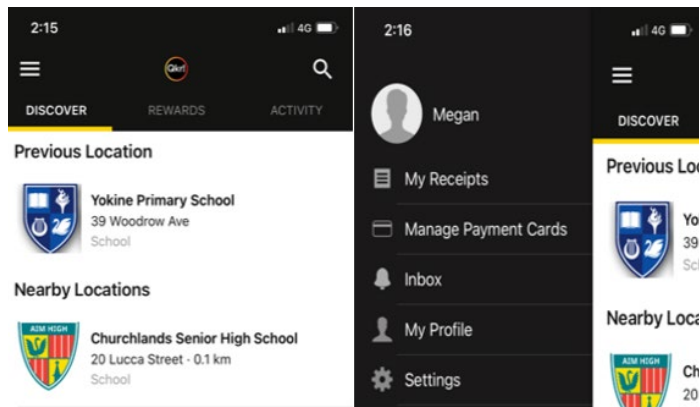

## How do I find my receipt on QKR?



When you open the app, prior to selecting the school, please click on the menu (3 horizontal lines in the top left hand corner), a drop down menu will appear and you can then select My Receipts. You can also set up automatic email receipts by opening the app clicking on the menu (3 horizontal lines in the top left hand corner), click settings – this will open the settings page and present you with a number of options to personalise the way Qkr! works for you.

Towards the bottom of the page you will see the option called “Automatic Email Receipts” which by default is set to off – slide to change this to ON.

## Formative Assessment - Example 11

### Year 7 Visual Arts – Ms Hattingh

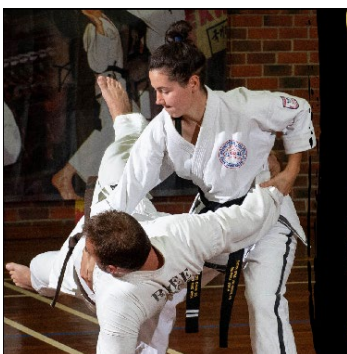
In year 7 Visual Art students create a landscape drawing that is then turned into a lino print. They study lino printing techniques and processes and create an edition of prints.

The formative assessment, self-assessment (traffic light activity) was completed by students prior to commencing their final landscape drawing/lino design. It requires students to measure their own level of understanding using the traffic light colours and descriptions. The teacher is then able to easily prioritise helping students and clarifying any misunderstanding while others move forward.



During a follow up lesson, once students have completed their lino design the formative assessment strategy of peer feedback was used. Students were reminded of the success criteria for the task and provided with constructive feedback sentence starters. They then moved around the room providing feedback to their peers, sharing a positive and an improvement while linking this to the success criteria.
