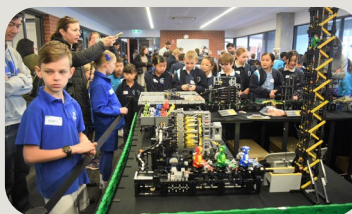
News in Brief

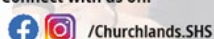

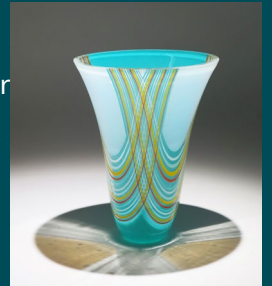
2023 Art@Churchlands community art exhibition - a note from the P&C President
