Medical Centre News

A reminder to students who have a diagnosed Anaphylactic medical condition and have been prescribed an **Adrenaline Autoinjector** by a medical practitioner.

These students must carry in school bags an **IN DATE Epipen or Anapen** at all times whilst on campus. If students leave the campus for any off site activities or excursions it is the students responsibility to take their personal Epipen with them.

Students who have a history of respiratory illness and require inhalers e.g.. **Ventolin**, are also required to carry their own inhalers in their school bag whilst on school grounds. Students are required to take their own inhalers off site when attending excursions and activities.

We would like to invite to parents to provide any updated copies of ASCIA Action plans for any students with diagnosed anaphylaxis or allergies. Please email the ASCIA document to the students appropriate year level Student Services administration so our database can be updated. Alternatively, a hard copy can be brought to the First Aid office.

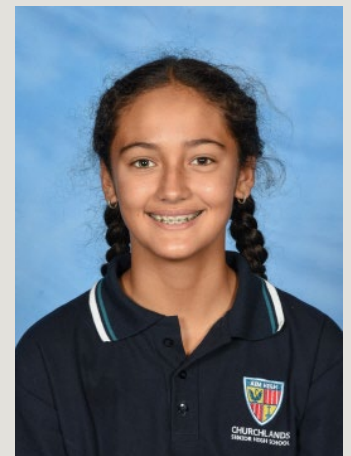

The purpose of this communication is intended that parents and caregivers gain a better understanding of the different elements of the Formative Assessment Info-graphic and Formative Assessment when in practice.

Example Four - Year 10 Art Design – Tracey Baker

The Year 10 Art Design students engage in a semester long project. At key points along their journey students are provided with opportunities to review and refine their project ideation through the self-reflection process. This is an example of student's engaging in Assessment as Learning.

1. Highlight the key words from your chosen design brief that provide relevant information.



You have been commissioned to design a Wall Mural for a blank wall next to a basketball court outside of (Stirling Leisure Centre) Karrinyup Recreation Centre. The owner would like to brighten up a dull blank wall on an otherwise well designed/modern Leisure Centre. Karrinyup Recreation Centre is located in Karrinyup right on the border of Doubleview and close to neighbouring suburbs of Scarborough and Wembley Downs. Karrinyup Recreation Centre wants to stand out from other privately owned gyms/stadiums in the area and attract the attention of those driving/walking by. The mural needs to suit Karrinyup Recreation Centres' current branding however, the client does not want the design to include the name or any existing branding/imagery. You have been given full artistic freedom with your choice of materials and techniques however, a stencil must be used within your design.



You have been commissioned to design a Wall Mural for a blank wall within a coffee shop named Alleycats Espresso. The owner would like to increase their revenue and draw more customers/passers-by into their coffee store. Alleycats Espresso is located within the busy Hillarys Boat Harbour near a variety of other food and drink outlets. Alleycats Espresso wants to stand out from their competitors with a bright and edgy wall mural. The mural needs to suit Alleycats Espresso's current branding however, the client does not want the design to include the store name or any existing branding/imagery. You have been given full artistic freedom with your choice of materials and techniques however, a stencil must be used within your design.

2. How have your design ideas address this information?

3. How does your design reflect the audience you have identified?

4. If you were the project manager for this project (your boss) What recommendations would you make to move forward? What needs revising or improving upon?

E-cigarette **fact sheet** for **parents** and **teachers**



E-cigarettes pose serious health risks to teens.

In 2019, 18.6% of Australian teens and young adults aged 15-24, who are current tobacco smokers, used e-cigarettes, **an increase from 6.6% in 2016**. A Royal Children's Hospital 'Child Health Poll' found 57% of parents have never discussed e-cigarettes with their teen. Social media is being used extensively by tobacco and e-cigarette companies to **market e-cigarettes to teens and young adults**.

About e-cigarettes

E-cigarettes, also known as '**vapes**', are **battery operated devices** that work by heating a liquid (or 'juice') until it becomes an aerosol that users inhale.

Some people mistakenly believe the '**cloud**' from vaping is a vapour, like steam. It is really **an aerosol**, a fine spray of **chemicals** that enter the body via the lungs and small particles that can **lodge in the lungs**. Using an e-cigarette is commonly called '**vaping**'.
