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Formative Assessment: Learning Intentions and Success Criteria Science Example

Reminder: Learning intentions are used to describe what we want our students to learn, and success criteria describe the criteria that we use to judge whether the learning activities in which we engaged our students were successful.

It is important that learning intentions and success criteria are visible for students. The example below was used in Science lesson on eclipses with Year 7 students.

Learning Intentions - What you are learning about

Explain how predictable phenomena on Earth are caused by the relative positions of the sun, Earth, and the moon

Success Criteria - What you should be able to do by the end of this lesson.

- Label and interpret a diagram of a solar eclipse.
- Label and interpret a diagram of a lunar eclipse.
- · Identify the difference between a solar and lunar eclipse.
- Explain why the duration and nature of eclipses varies

School Board Members Profiles




Matt Turnbull




