#### **House Coordinators**

#### Magpie nesting and swooping season

We would like to remind the community to take extra care when outdoors during magpie nesting season from August to November.



The following tips will help you stay safe and reduce the impact of a swooping magpie:

- Look out for any caution signage placed in parks and reserves, stay clear of nesting sites and plan alternative routes
- Do not provoke magpies as they swoop to protect their young
- Wear sunglasses, a wide brimmed hat (especially kids) or carry an umbrella

Travel in groups if possible as the birds often target individuals

- If you are riding a bike, dismount and walk through nesting magpie territory
- If you are swooped by a magpie, stay calm, walk away but do not run, and avoid looking towards the swooping birds.

### FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT Example 10 - Humanities & Social Sciences: Year 10 Modern History -

The Year 10 Humanities & Social Sciences (HASS) students commenced the study of History in Week 9 of Term 3. As part of this course, they are required to investigate the factors which led to the outbreak of WWII in 1939. One of the most significant of these factors included the signing of the Treaty of Versailles (1919).

The formative assessment retrieval task below was completed by the students at the start of one lesson. It requires them to match 'large' factors with their correlating 'small' factors to show they understand the cause and effect of some of the basic terms of the Treaty.




