Music Green Room

The tradition was continued this year with the renaming of the Green Room in Music and this time by honouring a very much-loved Churchlands SHS music teacher.

We are thrilled to rename our cherished School of Music Green Room in honour of our distinguished alumna Gillian Croston!

Gill is known to be a natural and sincere teacher. Her compassion, good humour, patience, cheeky persona and passion for music, made her a favourite

teacher of many students.



Between 1982 and 1997 Gill toured with the school to Tasmania, Switzerland, France, England, Singapore; USA; Hong Kong and China. She trained and conducted the orchestra in musical productions of Pirates, Pinafore and Cabaret and conducted the Symphony Orchestra; achieving outstanding results in countless festivals. She counts an astonishing array of professional and award-winning musicians, composers, academics and teachers among her students and so many others who enjoy music in their lives as amateurs, concert-goers and music parents.

Concert Hall

At the 50th Music Anniversary Concert held in June 2022, the beautiful Churchlands SHS Concert Hall was renamed as the Taryn Fiebig Concert Hall. Taryn's name was chosen for the concert hall for her remarkable achievements and lasting legacy in Music and her contributions to Churchlands SHS. The late Taryn Fiebig passed on in March 2021 after battling cancer.







2023 MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS



Congratulations to the Year 7 Gifted and Talented (GATE) Music students Mikelti Addo, Torah Bradley and Andrew Nasimov who are recipients of the 2023 Churchlands Foundation Music Scholarship worth \$3500 each. The awards were presented by Foundation Chair Mr John Gillon at the Year 7 Welcome BBQ held on Thursday 9 February 2023.

The recipients of the Scholarship are able to use the funds related to education and/or musical studies such as purchase of a musical instrument, stationery and books, excursions and camps, laptop, uniform and others.

In his remarks Mr Gillon stated the scholarship is possible through the *Solar Power to Scholarships Project* whereby savings from reduced electricity costs from the school solar panel system is directed towards scholarships and grants. He thanked parents, staff and CSHS Alumni for their generous contribution towards the installation of the solar panels.

He further added that in 2023, the Foundation has expanded the program in other areas such as academic, environmental, leadership, sports, languages and staff professional development that allows students and staff to work towards their education and teaching goals. More information can be found on the school website or by scanning the QR code.

Up until 2022, the Foundation has been able to offer 15 music scholarships worth \$4500 each to students in the Gifted and Talented Music Program. Students received \$2000 in Year 7 and \$500 in the consecutive years up to Year 12. Beginning 2023, the scholarship will be paid up to Year 10 to make provision for eligible students to access the Specialised Music Scholarship in Years 9-12. Students may take up specialised tuition including masterclasses and workshops, instrumental/composition tuition, purchase of a musical instruments and others.

Torah is very excited to be able to save the money to put towards a new professional trumpet as she progresses and improves in her trumpet studies. She hopes to purchase one closer to Year 11 when she is doing ATAR Music. It is an honour for Torah to be a recipient of the Churchlands Foundation GATE Music Scholarship for 2023 and she is loving her music studies at Churchlands SHS this year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Churchlands Foundation for the astounding honour of giving me a music scholarship. As I appreciate music and would like to learn to play more instruments, we have used part of the money to buy a Yanagisawa Soprano

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

Churchlands Foundation scholarships support individual educational attainment, recognising excellence and endeavour. Grants are offered to support special projects, events or opportunities.

The funds awarded will partly or fully subsidise fees and expenses in various educational areas.


Funding is also available to Churchlands SHS students or graduates who have completed Year 12 in the previous year and who have been accepted at University or TAFE as a full time student. Strong candidates must demonstrate academic diligence and give evidence of leadership qualities, extra-curricular pursuits or engagement in community service.

Up until May 2023, the Foundation has supported grants close to the value of \$48,000 that included diagnostic assessment for a student, funding for

music tour, staff professional development, student leadership program, language assistant and space innovation challenge for a group of students.

Applications for scholarships and grants will be assessed twice a year in May and October and at other times as deemed necessary or desirable by the Foundation. Some scholarships are subject to a separate process and do not require applications. The selection panel may decide at its discretion not to award any particular scholarship in any

The three alumni belong to the UWA and Curtin robotics team.


















BREAKFAST CLUB SPEAKERS

An integral part of the Senior School Program to motivate students to reach their potential is the esteemed "Breakfast Club". Participation in this program is for those students who have achieved a predicted ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) over 95 and will therefore be ranked in the top 5% of ATAR students in Western Australia.

Initial selection occurs after Semester 1 in Year 11 with the students remaining part of the program until they leave at the end of Year 12. During this two-year period more students are added to the program as their results improve. This is because it is important for them to have an opportunity to be part of a group who consistently 'Aim High'. In 2022, there were 64 students in the Year 12 program and the inaugural Year 11 Breakfast commenced with 42 students.

As in the past, two members from the alumni community were invited to share their continuous "Aim High" motto after leaving school both in their to academic and professional areas.

In 2022, our guest speakers included Dr Katya Fleming and Ellen Story. We are am very grateful to Katya and Ellen for sharing their memories of their time at Churchlands SHS and career path post high school.

Dr Katya Fleming 2006

Katya is a former student of Churchlands SHS and graduated from Year 12 with the Class of 2006. In Year 12 she studied Chemistry, English, Political and Legal Studies, Mathematics and



won the top performing student in Human Biology for that year.

Graduating from Churchlands prior to ATAR being introduced Katya would have received a Tertiary Entrance Rank and although she can't remember her exact score she can remember receiving the 10A grades award. Beyond academics Katya was an active member of the student parliament in the house of representative.

Her tertiary studies have been varied studying across a range of fields including physiology, psychology, archaeology, literature and languages. Completing her bachelor degree Katya continued her studies with post-graduate Doctor of Medicine. She is the founding director and current board member for Endometriosis Western Australia. While currently practicing Medicine she is training in Anatomical Pathology and working on various research projects predominately in gynaecological pathology

Ellen Story 2013

Ellen is a former student of Churchlands and graduated from Year 12 with the Class of 2013 in the role of Head Girl. Ellen continued her studies at UWA completing a Bachelor Degree in Arts and then



first class honours in International Relations and political Science. Upon completion of her Masters of Diplomacy at ANU she took a gap year travelling through Europe and Asia which also included volunteering as an English and Mathematics teacher in Nepal. Dr Geoffrey Lummis 1972

Geoffrey W. Lummis, PhD, is an established educator, researcher, and Associate Professor at Edith Cowan University. Born and raised in Perth, Australia, Geoff attended Churchlands Senior High School from 1968 to 1972. During his time there, he actively

participated in the school's football and athletics teams. Additionally, he demonstrated his creative side by performing in the school's inaugural rock concert, alongside fellow Year 12 students, in late 1972.




Geoff's academic journey at the School of Education at ECU spans 37 years in the field of initial teacher education. His contributions to academia were recognised with a visiting professorship at the University of Massachusetts during the early 1990s. Throughout his career, Geoff has been deeply involved in interdisciplinary research, exploring diverse areas such as Arts and STEM Education, Sustainability, Creativity, Cross-curriculum studies, and improving secondary school work place culture. His dedication to collaborative research is evident through his close collaborations with fellow academics and doctoral students. Geoff Has supervised over 40 higher degree students.

Beyond his scholarly pursuits, Geoff has displayed leadership and administrative skills through his extensive involvement in various academic and professional organisations. Notably, he served as the former Director of the Edith Cowan Institute for Education Research, where he oversaw numerous research initiatives. Geoff's commitment to promoting the welfare of academic staff led him to hold the position of President of the ECU Academic Staff Association. Furthermore, he actively contributes to the quality of education by serving

as the Chair of the Board of a secondary school in Perth.

Geoff's dedication to education extends beyond the university setting, as he has actively contributed to projects for the State Government and engaged in local science education and arts initiatives. His diverse range of interests also includes ceramics, where he has exhibited his work both in the United States and locally.

Reflecting on his educational journey, Geoff attributes his career choice to the influence of several inspiring teacher mentors and the transformative experiences he had at Churchlands Senior High School. Today, as a mentor educator, researcher, and administrator, Geoff continues to make authentic contributions to the field of education supporting future generations of teachers and researchers.


