

Curtin's UniReady in Schools Parent Information Evening



Why offer UniReady at Churchlands

- Provide a pathway to University for those students that have attempted an ATAR pathway in Year 11 but are finding it challenging. They are unlikely to achieve an ATAR of 70 or more for direct entry.
- An alternative pathway to University for those students that have not enrolled in an ATAR pathway but have demonstrated the academic potential by successfully completing at least one ATAR (C grade or better) in Year 11.
- Students, that for range of reasons (mental health, family issues, elite sporting commitments) could not complete a
 full ATAR enrolment or be successful on an ATAR pathway.



Successful completion of UniReady

- With the successful completion of UniReady, students will receive a notional ATAR of 70 and English Competency
- This will enable them to apply to a wide number of courses within Curtin University. Most Universities accept the
 various enabling programs.
- Upon successful completion students will be provided with an official academic transcript from Curtin University
- If a student fails a unit they are able to enrol in this unit over the summer period and if successfully completed they can enrol in University for that same year.



Guaranteed ATAR 70 vs Minimum ATAR 70



As you are looking at the different courses, you will notice that some courses will indicate a 'Guaranteed ATAR 70', this means that you will be guaranteed a place in the course as long as you successfully complete UniReady. Please note that some courses that are 'Guaranteed ATAR 70' have additional pre-requisite requirements that UniReady may not meet. You must check all criteria for your intended course.

Guaranteed ATAR 70 (Courses with Pre-Requisites)

While some courses indicate that they will guarantee you a place if you have an ATAR 70, they also require applicants to fulfil subject pre-requisites. The following courses require you to have to have at least ATAR Maths Application:

Guaranteed ATAR 70 (Courses with Pre-Requisites)

While some courses indicate that they will guarantee you a place if you have an ATAR 70, they also require applicants to fulfil subject pre-requisites. While most courses require you to have ATAR Maths Applications. The Mathematics and Science Majors for the Secondary Education degree require you to have the following:

- Essential WACE subjects (pre-requisites):
 Additional pre-requisites are required for the following majors:
 - Mathematics Education Mathematics Methods ATAR
 - Science Education (Biology) Mathematics Applications ATAR
 - Science Education (Chemistry) Chemistry ATAR and Mathematics Applications ATAR
- ∘ Science Education (Physics) Physics ATAR and Mathematics Methods ATAR

Guaranteed ATAR 70 vs Minimum ATAR 70



As you are looking at the different courses, you will notice that some courses will indicate on their admission criteria as 'Minimum ATAR 70, this means that you will need a minimum of 70 ATAR to be eligible for the course. Course entry is competitive. As a UniReady student, it means that you will need to fulfill addition criteria to be eligible and competitive for the course. Please see the following slides for more detail about 'Minimum ATAR 70' courses.

Minimum ATAR 70 Competitive Courses with requirements (#)

Biomedical Science (Bachelor of Science)

This course has a pre-requisite of ATAR Maths Applications and you must have a CWA of 50%

Students in the UniReady enabling program must complete the program with a course weighted average (CWA) of 50% or higher and must complete MATH0014 Mathematics for Science. BIOL0001 Introduction to Health Sciences or CHEM0006 Chemistry Essentials are desirable units but not essential.

The CWA is an average of the marks of the units you have attempted. The MATH0014 is not available via UniReady in Schools. If you are doing ATAR Maths Applications at school and get a CWA of 50% and over, you are eligible for this course. If you are unsure of your ATAR Maths Applications results, it is recommended that you have an application with this as a first preference and another application with a different course (without any pre-requisites) as a backup.



Minimum ATAR 70 Competitive Courses with requirements (#)

Nursing (Bachelor of Science)

Students in the UniReady enabling program must complete the program with a course weighted average (CWA) of 60% and a grade of 70% or higher in BIOL0001 Introduction to Health Sciences unit.

The CWA is an average of the marks of the units you have attempted. If you are unsure of your results and would like to have this course as your 1^{st} preference, it is recommended that you have another course as a 2^{nd} preference such a Bachelor of Science (Health Sciences).

The Bachelor of Science (Health Sciences) is a pathway course into courses with higher requirements within the Faculty of Health Sciences.

The Nursing degree is also very competitive and accepts limited numbers so a backup is always recommended. Nursing also requires additional English Language requirements for 2023. Please check the course information for Nursing on TISC.



Minimum ATAR 70 Competitive Courses with requirements (#)

Exercise and Sports Science

Students are assessed on their most recent SWA and overall CWA. Students must achieve a SWA or CWA of at least 60% to be considered eligible. Students in the UniReady course in either Semester 1 or 2 must achieve a CWA of 60% or higher to be considered eligible for the BSc(ESS) application process.

The CWA is an average of the marks of the units you have attempted. If you are unsure if you will get 60% or higher, and would like to have this course as your 1st preference, it is recommended that you have another course as a 2nd preference such a Bachelor of Science (Health Sciences) as this is a pathway course into courses with higher requirements within the Faculty of Health Sciences.



UniReady at Churchlands Senior High School

- Students will enrol in 4 units with each unit running over a semester. This will replace two courses on a student's timetable. The unit will be delivered by Churchlands SHS teachers on school site in a timetabled class.
- Churchlands will be offering the following units in the UniReady program

Fundamentals of Academic Writing – core unit Fundamentals of Communication – core unit Introduction to Health Science Mathematics Basics

- These units are endorsed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority. For the successful completion of each unit, students can be awarded a C grade towards the achievement of the Western Australian Certificate of Education
- It's important to note that a requirement of WACE is the completion of 10 units in Year 12. A maximum of two units can be awarded to WACE in Year 12 from Endorsed units. As UniReady is classified as an endorsed program if students do not pass a unit this does not count towards the 10 units and can place the achievement of WACE at risk.

UniReady 1 – Academic writing and communication UniReady 2 – Health Science and Maths

Only 2 units count towards WACE. Students must pass at least two of these units to achieve WACE

If two units are successfully completed then this student achieves WACE. With four units of UniReady completed they achieve WACE and direct entry into University with notional ATAR of 70

Student Eligibility

- Students that have a predicted ATAR below 70 are encouraged to apply
- It is recommended that students are enrolled in at least one ATAR course in Year 11 if they are on the Blended pathway
- Students on a Blended pathway need to have achieved a minimum of a C grade in at least one ATAR course for Semester 1.

Application Process

Application Process

Stage 1 – Written application, attendance and achievement review

- Written application that should include;
 - Why you want to go to Curtin University?
 - What degree you would like to pursue and why?
 - What strengths do you have that you believe will help you to be successful in the UniReady program?
 - If successful which two courses would you like the Uniready program to replace?
- Current attendance and achievement in Year 11 courses will be taken into consideration

Written applications must be received by 3pm Monday 29 July

Stage 2

Based on the above criteria students will be shortlisted to Stage 2. Teacher feedback will be requested on the following criteria in all current courses to make the final selection

- work ethic
- engagement
- critical thinking
- ability to work independently



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
