Learning Support News

Throughout Term 2 students in Years 10-12 will sit Semester 1 exams.

Students with a diagnosed learning disorder or condition that affects their ability to demonstrate their knowledge in timed conditions may be eligible for Equitable Access to Assessments.

If your child has a diagnosis affecting their learning and they do not currently have a Learning Support Plan or Student Profile in place, please email the Learning Support Team (<u>A_learningsupportteam@churchlands.wa.edu.</u> <u>au</u>) with details of their diagnosis, including supporting documentation (diagnostic reports, specialist letters etc). Someone will then be in contact with you to discuss your child's situation further so we can determine their eligibility.

This information must be received by Friday 2 May. Unfortunately the school can not guarantee the provision of equitable access to assessments in next term's exams if information is received after this date.

Students who have a Learning Support Plan or Student Profile that states their current special exam arrangements do not need to do anything. A member of the Learning Support Team will be in contact in due course to arrange their arrangements for next terms exams.

Famous Australians living with a disability or learning disability:

Em Rusciano

- Profession: Comedian, Singer, and Writer.
- Disability: Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Dyslexia.
- Contributions: Rusciano is known for her candid discussions about her neurodivergence, using humour and storytelling to raise awareness and reduce stigma surrounding ADHD and learning difficulties.

Learning Support News (cont'd)

Em Rusciano, an Australian comedian, singer, and writer, has openly discussed her experiences with ADHD and dyslexia. Diagnosed later in life, these conditions shaped her approach to both her career and life. Rather than viewing her disabilities as setbacks, Rusciano embraced them, using humour and self-awareness to turn them into advantages.

Her ADHD, which affects focus and organisation, contributed to her creative and non-linear thinking, fueling her comedic style and innovative performances. She also uses her platform to advocate for neurodiversity, promoting

understanding and support for those with ADHD and learning disabilities.

Through her honesty about her challenges, Rusciano has built a loyal following and inspired many to embrace



their own differences. Her ability to find humour in her struggles has helped destigmatise learning disabilities and mental health, making her a relatable and influential figure.



What is Reconnect?

Reconnect provides outreach support to young people aged 12-18 years and their families who are experiencing family conflict which has led to unstable accommodation or could eventually lead the young person being unable to stay at home.

The program uses an early intervention, outreach approach to address family conflict, strengthen relationships and help to stabilise living and education circumstances

Reconnect can support young people with:

- Strengthening personal relationships . Providing information on services in the community
- Communication, emotional awareness and confidence building
- Resolving conflict with family and friends Creating linkages into the community, sport
- and recreational programs Home and school life .
- Referral pathways to appropriate support services .

Reconnect can support parents, guardians and families with:

- Conflict resolution
- . Understanding the needs of their young people
- Communication and emotional awareness
- Knowledge of community and parenting services Providing the building blocks to create a more positive home environment
