Students Using eRideables

eRideables can include eBikes, eScooters and eSkateboards

These have become a very popular means of transport and there are now WA Traffic Laws associated with them.

These include:

- Only students who are 16 and over are legally allowed to ride eRideables.
- When riding, a helmet must be worn.
 Due to their increased use at Churchlands, we will implement the following requirements to ensure safety and legal compliance.

Acceptable use at Churchlands will now require the following:

- Only Year 11 and/or 12 students will be allowed to bring these onto the school premises.
- For safety purposes students must walk these off the school grounds in the afternoon.
- Students must store eRideables in our locked bike compounds not outside.

This week the school aims to educate students around these changes but from next week normal school behaviour management processes will be applied.

Year 9 HASS - Biome Study

Students have enjoyed their Geography studies this term, becoming experts in their chosen biome. Creative posters

were produced showing aspects such as location, climate, adaptation of species and human modifications. We hope to have some on display in the library for all to see the wonderful work some of the students have done.





Year 12 Geography: A Day Out In The Field - 'From the Beach to the Bush' -

The students enjoyed a day out at the beach recently to study the impacts of climate change and adaptation strategies

to deal with climate change. Mettam's Pool and Waterman's Bay proved the perfect spots especially in such awesome weather, given the last few years we have be rained out!

From the coast we headed to the bush to visit two Bush Forever sites – Star Swamp Reserve in (North Beach) Lake Gwelup to consider a strategy that addresses land cover change. These sites ticked more than one syllabus point as the wetland areas were bone dry due to lack



of rain especially at this time of the year, coupled with record breaking temperatures experienced in Autumn.



Article 5: Formative In Action - Peer Marking -

After a lesson on the seasons, Year 7 students completed a quiz to check their understanding. They then peer-marked the quizzes and used the success criteria to identify one area their partner could improve.

As part of the process, they also selected an activity from a list of targeted tasks that their partner could complete to strengthen their understanding. This strategy activated students as learning resources for one another and encouraged them to think critically about the quality of work. Referring to the success criteria helped students identify specific gaps in understanding and clarify what to work on next. This made the feedback process more meaningful and supported students in taking ownership of their learning by setting clear, actionable goals.

Success Criteria

Describes how Earth's tilt and orbit result in seasonal changes.

Explains why opposite hemispheres experience different seasons at the same time.

Accurately labels diagrams showing Earth's tilt and orbit around the Sun.

Uses diagrams to explain how seasonal variation occurs.


Library News


WAYRBA Competition






