

Formative Assessment 5 Key Strategies

Dylan Wiliams is a professor emeritus of educational assessment at the University College in London. For the past 20 years, Wiliam's work has focused on the profound impacts of embedding classroom formative assessment on student learning. The materials he has developed provide the structure that underpins our formative assessment initiative with the five strategies highlighted below forming the basis of professional learning courses we provide at the school and the activities are implementing in our classrooms.
