- Through the 'Solar Power to Scholarships Project', the Churchlands Foundation is able to channel the savings from the reduced electricity costs towards scholarship and grant programs for students and staff. Up until 2022 only Music scholarships have been available. In 2023, The Foundation will be expanding the scholarship program to include academic, environmental, group leadership, individual leadership and special focus programs. - Native seedlings grown at Churchlands by gardening club students were planted last week as an ongoing initiative to combat land degradation. 18 students travelled to the Corrigin and Yealering districts for the 2022 Trees for Survival Camp. Students developed an awareness of environmental practices in the Wheatbelt area of WA. The student volunteers are to be commended.
- Over 100 parents and students joined the school tour last Friday to hear from the Principal and view the facilities of the school. When questioned, students relayed that they loved the Arts, Woodwork and STEM rooms in addition to the amazing Sports Hall.
- A national action plan will be developed to fix the 'massive challenge' of teacher shortages. The plan will focus on strategies to encourage more people to become teachers, to help prepare them for the workforce and to retrain the teachers already in employment.

Formative Assessment Year 8 Food - Example 8

Year 8 Food - Ms Gillies

In Year 8, students study Home Economics over two terms. One term is Food and one term is Textiles. During the first week of Food, students are introduced to the cooking room and their first recipe – pizza muffins.

Each week students work in groups of 2-3 to make a recipe. This formative assessment sheet is given out individually. It allows students to reflect on how they feel they went individually and as part of their team. We use this data to assess if students are understanding the key content learnt in class that week, as well as to check if they are able to follow the practical class requirements. Cooking at school can sometimes be quite different to cooking at home!

Pizza Muffin Self Evaluation

Congratulations on your first practical lesson in Home Economics! Now you are going to reflect on how it went.

- How did you go with collecting the ingredients and will you do it differently next practical lesson?
- Did you work effectively in your group? Give examples.
- What would you rate the taste of your pizza muffin out of 10?
- Could it be improved, and if so, how?
- Did you stack your dirty dishes on the correct side, use
- hot soapy water and a dish cloth to clean them?
- Do you think a pizza muffin is a healthy snack? Explain
- why/why not.
- If you were to make this again, what would you do
- differently?



The Fathering Project Top Tips

- 1. Check in every day
- 2. Reading their signals
- 3. Talk about body boundaries

Top Tips everyday connecting

- Make time to connect at home together each day if possible. When you get home from work, around the table at dinner time, or at bedtime.
- Check in with each child for a chat about what they have been doing, how they are feeling and any news they have.
- Really 'BE THERE'. Put away the phone and connect with your kids.
- Create opportunities to communicate. You never know when your child will open up to talk about something really important to them.
- Listen to them and get to know about your child as an individual. Their thoughts, their feelings, likes and dislikes, their friends and their dreams.
