An avid scientist with a passion for physics, chemistry and materials, particularly where these intersect the development of next generation photovoltaic, battery, sensor, composite material and electronics technology.

Justin encouraged students to work hard, be flexible and to be prepared to be challenged outside their comfort zones.

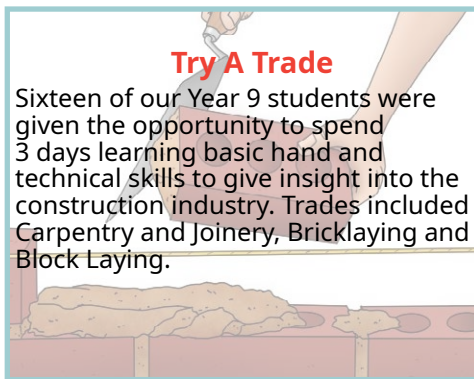
Young writers workshops Fremantle Literature Centre

FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



Ashleigh Streeter-Jones is part of the team behind the Raise Our Voice in Parliament campaign, an initiative of Raise Our Voice Australia.

Together with partners UNICEF, YWCA Australia, Run for It and Generation Politics, they have invited Federal MPs across the country to commit to reading 90-second speeches written by young people from their electorate in Parliament from 18-21 October 2021 for the inaugural Youth Voice in Parliament week. This nonpartisan initiative endeavours to increase the political literacy of all our young voters and voters-to-be (individuals under the age of 21).

I am contacting you because local MP, Celia Hammond, has signed up to participate in the campaign. The team would love to invite your students to participate in the campaign by submitting a speech.

Speeches should address the prompt

"What is your vision for Australia in 20 years?"

and should be roughly around 200 words.

Speeches can be submitted via our website at www.raiseourvoiceaustralia.com/youthvoice - there are a number of FAQs on the website, too.

Speech submissions close on 21 September. The Raise Our Voice Australia team will then create a shortlist which will be passed to the office of the MP, with the MP to choose the final speech.

Should students need some extra support or want to speak to someone from the team as they write their speech, we will be hosting three online drop in sessions at the following dates and times:

Tuesday 31 August 1330-1430

Wednesday 8 September 1700-1800

Thursday 16 September 1600-1700

The links to register are available through our social media channels (Raise Our Voice Australia on Facebook, and @raiseourvoiceaus on Instagram). Once speech submissions close, we will also invite speech submitters to attend a number of online workshops run by organisations working with young people. Workshops will be curated to support young people to increase their knowledge of Australia's political system, and their skills as advocates and change makers.

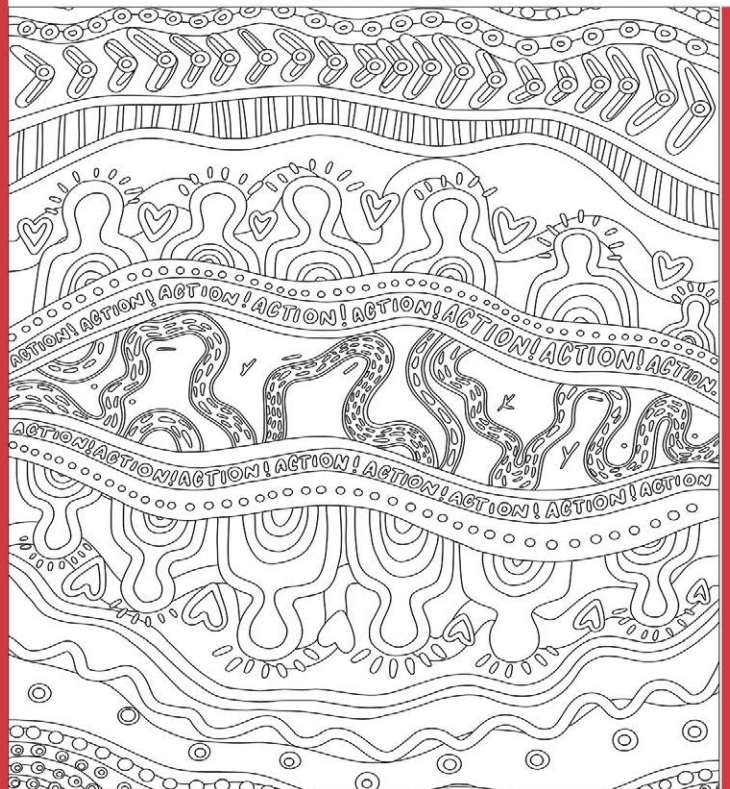
