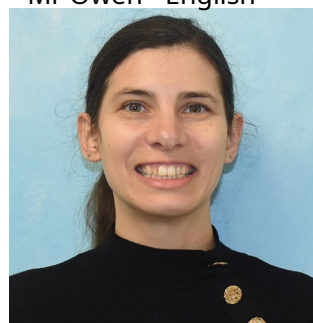

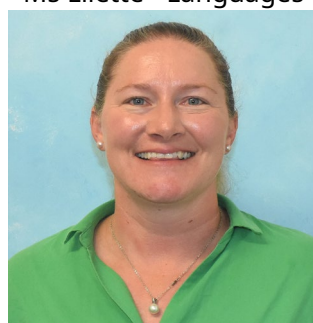

Below is an example of where I have used a website called Liveworksheets.com to determine student understanding, either at the start or end of lessons. These tasks provide me with data to assess if students understand key concepts or if further consolidation is required.
