Reminder: Learning intentions are used to describe the things that we want our students to learn, and success criteria describe the criteria that we use to judge whether the learning activities in which we engaged our students were successful.

This checklist was used in both Year 11 and 12 Chemistry when students were completing chemistry calculation problems based on the mole concept. Presenting the success criteria in a checklist format provides the structure for teacher to assess students or students to conduct peer or self-assessment. The feedback they gain enables them to understand what they need to do to ensure that they meet the criteria next time they complete a calculation. Checklists such as this may include examples next to each statement showing the students what each checkpoint looks like in context, further scaffolding the use of this strategy.

Checklist	Content
	Write a formula or equation if required
	Use notations such as n(NaNO3), m(Na) or c(HCI) before any working to show what you are calculating
	Working out starts on the left-hand side of the page and works down or across in a sequential manner
	All mathematical processes are clearly show on page such 3/1 x 2 =
	Any ratio used is clearly shown and the maths used to calculate it.
	Answer is provided to the correct number of significant figures
	Answer includes appropriate units
	Total


them what is working and what isn't.
