Formative Assessment English - Example 5

Year 7 AEP Science - Kym Lucchesi

After completing classroom activity to distinguish between mass and weight students were asked in the last 5 minutes of the lesson to complete this exit card. I collected and reviewed their responses.

In this next lesson I handed them back for students to do a think, pair, share activity with a students who had recorded a different response to help clarify their misconceptions. After they had a chance to share and discuss we reviewed and marked the question.

Mass vs Weight Exit Card

In the column on the left place a tick if the statement is correct and a cross if it is incorrect.

Statement The mass of an object can change depending on gravity. My weight would be the largest on the biggest planet in the solar system.

Weight is a force and should be measured in Newtons.

If my mass is 50kg on Earth it will be 50kg on the Moon.

My mass will be the greatest on the smallest planet in the solar system.

Weight is calculated by multiplying mass by the gravitational strength.

My weight will be the same on the Earth and the Moon.
