Celebrating it's 20th Anniversary the Creating Community Art Exhibition proved again to be a highlight on the school calendar.

200 artists, staff, students and community members attended the Opening Night to view the 300 artworks led this year by Guest Artist Anne Sorensen. Anne, an award winning glass artist makes exquisite pieces which are a culmination of thirty years of honing her craft.

Churchlands students submitted 15 pieces and students were treated to having their work area in the Arts Department turned into an exhibition space where they were free to peruse the art and be exposed to an array of mediums on show.



Virtual Babies Program

Year 11 Children,

Family and Community classes

It's that time of year again! For all of term 2 the Year 11 Children, Family and Community classes will be running the virtual baby program. The program focuses on the challenges of having a baby. It cries at random, unpredictable times 24 hours a day. It can cry for attention, a nappy change, clothing change due to temperature sensitivity, feeding, burping, rocking, or even if its just feeling fussy. Students may need to tend to the baby for a few second at a time, up to 45 minutes. Each simulation runs for 2 nights and 3 days. By the end of the simulation period students are very eager to return the baby and get some proper sleep again!

The school is also lucky enough to own some pregnancy vests and some demonstration babies – shaken baby, foetal alcohol baby and drug affected baby which we will start looking at after the exam period.

The event was well attended, with about 40 teachers present, and the event received positive feedback from attendees.

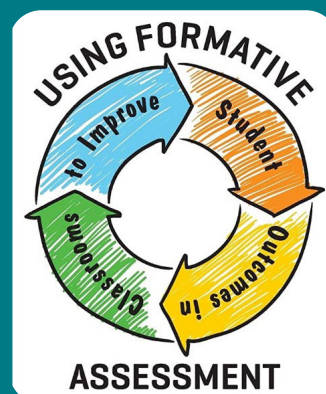
