
















Parents wishing to contact their students for emergencies only, can do so via reception on 9441 1700.

Formative Assessment English - Example 3

In term 2 the school will share information with you about Formative Assessment practices.

The purpose of this communication is intended that parents and caregivers gain a better understanding of the different elements of the Formative Assessment Info-graphic and Formative Assessment when in practice.

Example Three - Year 12 ATAR English - Mrs Miyanna Stretch

This is an example of how students in year 12 ATAR English were enabled to create their own success criteria for comprehension short answer responses.

For students to create their own success criteria, they were given examples of excellent work by previous students. In groups they interrogated these exemplars, discussed their merits and devised a set of success criteria to share with the class in a mini tutorial. Here is an example of what one group of students came up with:

What makes a good response? You've been writing comprehension short answer responses in English for years now, but, it's really important to keep building on and refining your skills. So how do you know what makes a strong short answer response?

Below are some comprehension responses by students completing the 2017 and 2018 WACE exams. Each response got excellent marks. In your group of 3, read a selection of the responses, cross reference them against the rubric below and discuss exactly what it is that these students are doing that is excellent. Then as a group produce something to show your peers how to ace the comprehension section.


