Formative Assessment: Feedback Example 2 Whole Class Response

FEEDBACK

to the learning intention.

The "Whole Class Response" is a formative assessment strategy where the teacher asks the class questions and collects responses from every student. This helps the teacher check understanding, identify areas of confusion, and adapt teaching.

It promotes student engagement and discussion in the classroom.

Online platforms like Kahoot! and Quizizz enhance this strategy. The above image is a Quizizz formative assessment that has been designed to check for understanding with Year 8 students after they have completed a period of student directed learning. The teacher will assign the task to the class and students respond on their devices. As the students complete the questions, the teacher will receive instant feedback. This feature not only makes the process more efficient but also enables the teacher to gauge student comprehension in real-time, identify areas where students may need further support, and adjust their instruction accordingly. It's an effective way to make formative assessment engaging and informative in the digital age.

Special Exam Arrangements

Dear Parents/Guardians of current year 11 students who are intending to study at least one ATAR subject in Year 12, 2024.

Equal Access to Assessment. (previously known as Special Exam Arrangements)

These concessions are available to students who have a permanent or temporary disability/diagnosis. Depending on the diagnosis these arrangements may include extra working time, rest breaks, use of a laptop, diabetic provisions, and out of order seating.

Many students are already accessing these provisions at a school level, however for students to access the arrangements for their final WACE exams (November 2024) the school is required to submit an "Application for Equal Access to Assessments: ATAR Course examination 2024" to "School Curriculum and Standards Authority" (SCSA) to have these arrangements approved for use.

Application forms are mostly completed at school, however current documentation from an independent allied health professional is required to support our applications. If your child has a Specific Learning Disorder (e.g. Dyslexia, Dysgraphia), or Motor Dysgraphia/Hypermobility, reports need to be dated after 1 December, 2021.

If your child is accessing external support for a mental health condition, or an ADHD or ASD diagnosis, and believe they would benefit from rest breaks during examinations, please contact Jane Price or David Cox, Learning Support Co-ordinator (Years 10 – 12), on 9441 1796 or jprice@churchlands.wa.edu.au, or d.cox@churchlands.wa.edu.au for further information. Documentation to support a diagnosis needs to be provided by a Clinical Psychologist and/or a Psychiatrist.

Applications are required to be submitted to SCSA a week prior to the end of Term One, 2024, therefore supporting documentation will be required by the Learning Support Co-ordinator no later than Tuesday, 19 March 2024. Please mark these "Attention: Jane Price or David Cox".

Should you have any questions around other disabilities/diagnoses not mentioned above, please email us details and we will respond with the appropriate information.

Although we submit all the documentation to support our application for EAAs, we can't guarantee the provisions applied for will be approved as the SCSA assessors are very strict in their application of their criteria.




