"As part of the school's UniReady program, Year 12 students paid a visit to Curtin University – Bentley Campus on the 31st of March. This excursion provided them with a valuable opportunity to explore the campus, get a taste of university life, and make connections with lecturers in their preferred subject areas. On the day, students watched presentations by current students on their pathway to university, undertook a scavenger hunt familiarising themselves with the campus, and experienced faculty 'tasters' in the areas of: Business and Law, Health Sciences, Humanities, and STEM.

In its first year, the school's UniReady program offers year 12 students the opportunity to develop valuable research, study and writing skills to enable them to succeed at university, as well as providing them with a guaranteed entry pathway into a variety of Curtin University courses in 2024.


Is your student leaving early?

Learning Intentions and Success Criteria An Introduction

Learning intentions and success criteria are one of the five key strategies used in the implementation of formative assessment. Below is an extract from the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership which outlines what learning intentions and success criteria are and why they are important. In the next editions of bytes, I will be providing examples from a range of subjects to illustrate what they look like in the classroom.

WHAT IS IT?

Learning Intentions are descriptions of what learners should know, understand and be able to do by the end of a learning period or unit. Learning intentions are the basis for tracking student progress, providing feedback and assessing achievement. In addition to learning intentions, students may also have individual learning goals that they address in their learning.

Success criteria are the measures used to determine whether, and how well, learners have met the learning intentions.

WHY LEARNING INTENTIONS AND SUCCESS CRITERIA?

- Ensure all students know what they are going to learn and where they are heading.
- · Provide guidance to teachers on what their chosen teaching and learning activities are seeking to achieve.
- Provide the basis for feedback and reduce discrepancies between current student understanding and intended learning.
- Assist students and teachers in tracking and assessing student progress.
- Help teachers to understand the impact of their teaching and learning activities, and when they may need to adapt or change these.
- · Help students understand what improved performance looks like.


