We appreciate the support of parents and guardians in getting our students to school on time.






Formative Assessment Eliciting Evidence of Learning Example 3

Reminder:

Eliciting evidence of learning is a formative assessment strategy that involves teachers using planned practices to collect information to establish where students are in their learning and use this to inform the next step.

Mathspace.co is an online platform which allows the teacher to create custom tasks which align with the lessons that are being taught in class. In one class the teacher creates a weekly summary task with questions to test the students' understanding of the concepts covered that week.

Once the questions are completed the staff member uses an analytical tool to identify strengths and weaknesses of the class and individual students. An image of what the class feedback could look like is shown below. This information is used to create further tasks to consolidate the areas of weakness in future lessons.

Hi there. I'm Moose, a chocolate coloured Labrador Retriever. I'm training to become an assistance dog with WAAT Dogs (Western Australian Assistance and Therapy Dogs).

When I graduate, I'll team up with a person who needs my help. Maybe someone with diabetes, epilepsy, or autism, or someone living with mental or physical challenges. You might see me wandering around the school with my trainer who is teaching me how to behave in public places where dogs don't usually go, like shops, restaurants and schools.

I'm 9 months old, which for a dog is like being a teenager, so I should fit right in at high school. I can get a little distracted by people, noises and smells (especially food). Learning to ignore these and stay focused on my person is most important. You can help me succeed by giving me space, avoiding eye contact, and not touching me. Sometimes my trainer might challenge me and want you to provide some controlled distraction, but most of the time you should just go about your day without giving me attention.

If you have any questions, you can always ask my trainer who will be more than happy to chat.
