#### Well Done Mock Trials Team

The Churchlands Senior High School mock trial team were victorious once again in their first finals round on Wednesday 2nd August at the Supreme Court against Carey Baptist College. This meant our students are now ranked within the top 8 teams from over 100 teams competing across Perth in the interschool mock trial competition.

In this round, the students from year 10 and 11 prepared for a civil law trial in which they acted as the plaintiff. Our skilled barristers and solicitor had to convince the presiding judge on the balance of probabilities that our client was worthy of receiving compensation. With the matter involving misleading and deceptive conduct in the negotiations to buy an off the plan luxury penthouse apartment. The case materials were of a technical and complex nature and the students did very well working as a team to prepare and deliver their case in the short time available.

There were some stand out performances by both our barristers and witnesses who worked well under pressure, having to think and reply on the spot to questions while remaining calm and confident. No easy feat! Students now have a fortnight to prepare for the next final round which will see 8 teams compete and 4 progress to the next round.

#### Formative Assessment Eliciting Evidence of Learning Example 1

#### Reminder:

Eliciting evidence of learning involves teachers using planned practices to collect information to establish where students are in their learning and use this to inform the next step.

An exit card is a short activity completed at the end of a lesson designed to provide teachers with feedback on how the students are tracking in relation to the learning intentions and success criteria for that lesson.

The example below was used in a Year 7 Science class when the success criteria was to distinguish between the terms mass and weight. In one class the teacher gave students time at the end of the lesson to complete this individually and collected it as they left class. The teacher reviewed the responses without marking the task.

In this case the feedback indicated that most identified some correct statements but either got one incorrect or did not select all the correct statements. They therefore decided to start the next lesson by handing back the papers to the students and provide them with time to compare answers with other students so they could discuss why they thought the statements were correct or incorrect before reviewing the correct answers in class.

If the feedback from this task was that the students either all understood the concept or mostly did not understand the concept the approach the teacher would take in the follow up lesson would look different.
