### [MUSIC PERFORMANCE UNIFORMS](#)

Please make sure your child has an appropriately fitting music uniform for the Intermediate and Junior concerts coming up in Term 2, available from the uniform shop. Appropriate footwear and socks/stockings are very important. BLACK socks or BLACK opaque stockings along with SMART Black concert shoes. Black sports shoes and/or Black sports shoes with white soles are NOT to be WORN.

Just a reminder to put these events in your calendar if you are in the marching bands or in the memorial band.

Memorial Band – Sunset Service April 24 – Leaving school at 1515 dressed in your marching band uniforms. King’s Park by 1600 – finish at about 1730 at which point the band members are their parent’s responsibility.

Marching Bands – Meeting in your designated places (TBA) on St George’s Terrace by 0800 on April 25, marching band uniform, instruments (no cases), and concluding on the esplanade around 1100 at which point the band members are their parent’s responsibility.

Driveway bugle call – something to consider on Anzac Day at 0600. Mr Robinson has done this each Anzac Day morning since 2020 (He even got filmed! 📹) – He lets his neighbours know and most of the street turn out and stand on their driveways with lit candles. You can perform it on any instrument.
