Fundraiser by Yvette Long: Stem cell treatment for MS

A message from Yvette Long, one of our teachers in Technologies:

For those who don't know, I was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) in 2023. MS is an autoimmune chronic illness where my immune system attacks the myelin sheath of the nerves in my brain and spine. Symptoms vary greatly from person to person, and unfortunately for me, it affects my walking, balance, and leg strength as well as a long list of symptoms you can't see. It stops me from doing many things others take for granted, like going for a walk—especially on the beach. I often have to cancel plans with friends due to fatigue. It's relentless, ongoing, and deteriorating. There is no cure, and medications just slow the inevitable decline.

Years of research has been done by an amazing doctor in America, Dr. Burt, who has developed a protocol to halt the progression of MS. In some cases, it has even improved symptoms and put people into remission for decades. It's called HSCT (haematopoietic stem cell transplantation). Although there are trials currently happening in Australia, I don't qualify

because I haven't been diagnosed long enough. Like so many treatments not available here, I need to travel abroad to access this life-changing procedure—and the sooner it's done, the better the outcome. This comes with a massive expense, as the treatment requires a monthlong hospital stay with 24/7 monitoring due to the risk of life-threatening infections from high dose chemotherapy.

I've started a GoFundMe page to help cover the cost, BUT a very good friend of mine, Trenton (he's a bit of a character!), has very kindly offered to perform a show he has written and previously performed to the public—just for me—with **100% of ticket sales** going towards the treatment. He's performed at Fringe Festival in the past and is incredibly entertaining. This show is all about the nostalgia of drive-in movies. It's a jam packed one hour show. Thanks to generous donations through GoFundMe, I've been able to secure a date for the procedure. It will be done in New Delhi, India, at a world-class hospital in November. I'm currently only halfway to covering the full cost, which is why Trenton's offer means so much and every little bit helps.

This is where you come in. Attached is a flyer for the show, along with a link and QR code to book tickets. The event will take place on Saturday, 16 August here at school in the Auditorium. It will be a fun night out—bring friends and family—and I'll be so very grateful for any support.
