Mock Trials - Churchlands Chambers

The Churchlands Chambers (Year 11s and 12s) and the Bench Warmers (Year 10s) have won their first round in the Mock Trial Competition for 2024. Both teams went against Applecross SHS teams on Wednesday, 13 March, at the Supreme Court of Western Australia. The case was a criminal charge of assault involving an elderly gentleman as the complainant and a younger man as the accused who were involved in a late-night altercation in a Perth park. Mrs Cornelius and Mrs Steer were impressed by the level of collegiality and teamwork shown in the lead up as well as the preparation and time that all students put into preparing for their first trial. There were some stellar advocacy performances by our students in particular barristers and witnesses on both teams. The teams will now be working to prepare their next case which will take place in Term 2.

NAPLAN 2024

From 13-18 March our Year 7 and Year 9 students took over the M Block and sat the online NAPLAN assessments. NAPLAN measures a student's literacy and numeracy and can be used to compare their development over time individually and against national standards. NAPLAN



is comprised of 4 tests: Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. Our students demonstrated personal responsibility through organisation and perseverance to maximise the skills they had developed through classroom preparation provided by our excellent teachers.


Formative Assessment: Strategy 4

- Activating Students as Learning Resources for One Another -

Example 1 - Art Feedback Sandwich

In the classroom, the art feedback sandwich strategy is a structure students follow to provide other students with

constructive feedback on their artistic pursuits. Mimicking the layers of a traditional sandwich, this method starts with praising the student's artwork, then presents helpful critiques and suggestions for enhancement, and concludes with another positive note or recognition of the student's dedication and progress. By employing this technique, educators tap into the power of peer learning, encouraging students to become valuable resources for one another.

They learnt how to use fieldwork tools to measure fuel load, canopy cover and steepness of slopes and acquired knowledge on life saving preparation and mitigation strategies needed if living in bushfire prone areas.






What does the YRG do?
