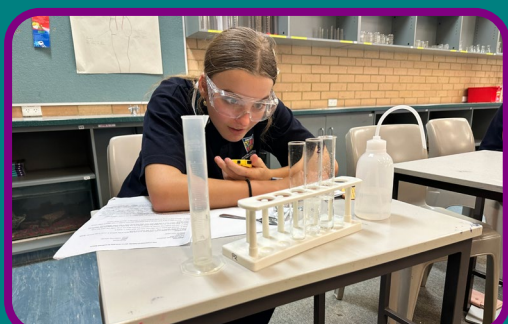

Akashi Nishi Sister School Visit

We are excited to welcome our sister school, Akashi Nishi, to Churchlands SHS! The group will arrive on Saturday, 3 August, and depart on Monday, 12 August. This visit marks the 38th year of our connection, which began in 1986 when the agreement was formalised.

A heartfelt thank you goes out to all our host students and families, as well as the dedicated teachers who are volunteering their time to offer special classes for our guests. If you see the Akashi Nishi students around the school, please extend a warm welcome, say hello, and be part of this wonderful cultural exchange.



Churchlands Alumni representing Australia at the 2024 Paris Olympics

Matthew Richardson represented Australia in the Tokyo Olympics in the team sprint just missing out on a medal. Matthew enrolled at Churchlands in 2012 as a Gymnast but turned to cycling following an injury. Matthew won gold at the 2022 Commonwealth Games, is now a world Champion and starts favourite in the Olympics for both the track sprint and track Kieren events.



Sam Welshford is also a cyclist winning back-to-back team pursuit Junior world titles in 2013 and 2014 while a student at Churchlands. In the 2016 Rio Olympics he won a silver medal in the Teams pursuit, in 2019 that same team smashed the world record in winning the world championships. Forming a new team, they won Bronze in Tokyo and will again represent Australia in the Men's Teams pursuit.

Maddison Keeney won a Bronze medal in the Rio Olympics in the 3-metre synchronised diving. She has won world titles in this same event and is also a gold medallist at the 2022 Commonwealth Games. This year she has represented Australia in four events at the Doha World Championships, winning one title and placing 2nd, 3rd and 4th in her other events.

We also have another Olympian in basketball **Sunday Dench**; however he will represent Sudan in the Men's Basketball tournament. Sunday was a member of the Wildcats before taking a contract with the Adelaide 36ers.

STEM Students Attend Curtin Summit

Students from the Churchlands STEM Program are participating in the Curtin University BinarX Program which will see them design and build a cube satellite payload for launch in coming years. This exciting project is currently in the mission objective stage, where students are presenting their payload concepts to scientists and engineers and seeking feedback on the next steps in their development. From here, students will start prototyping their designs at school before the all-important initial testing phase of the project begins!

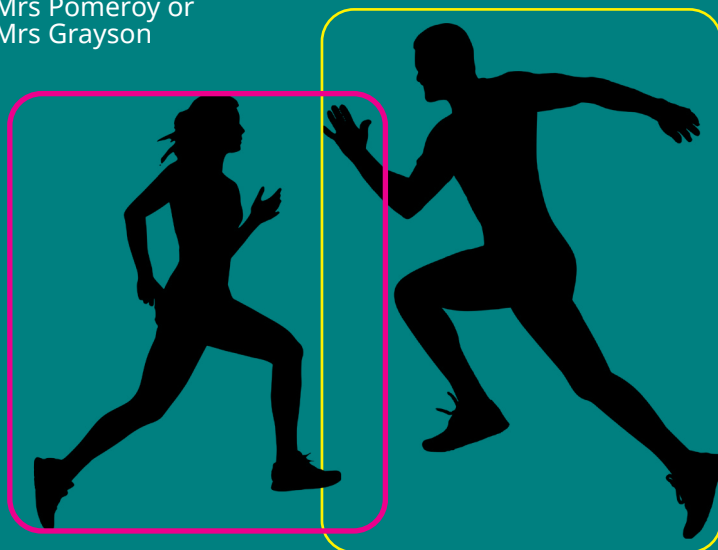

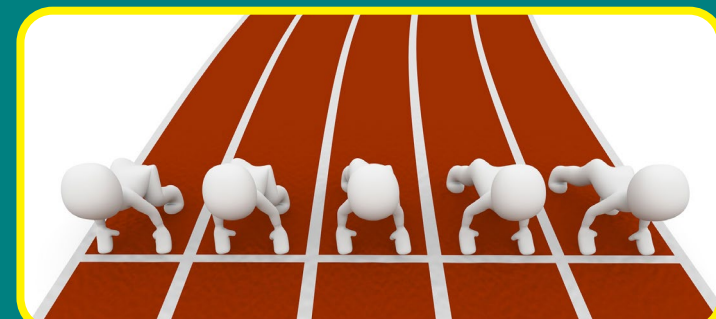

To keep everyone secure, start by:

- Educating your family about the importance of strong, unique passwords and the dangers of sharing personal information online.
- Use reliable antivirus software and keep all devices updated to guard against malware and viruses.
- Implement parental controls to monitor and restrict inappropriate content, and teach children about recognising phishing attempts and suspicious links.
- Regularly back up important data to mitigate the impact of potential cyber-attacks.

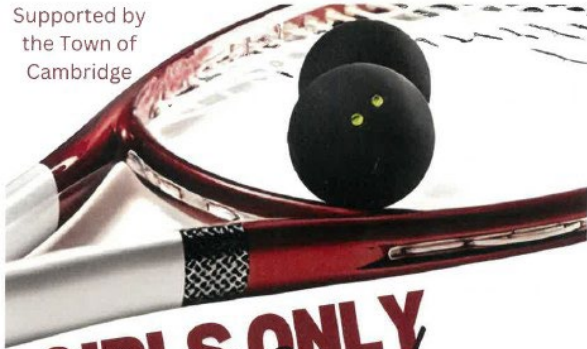

Update your apps and devices

Updating your apps and devices can fix issues and address new security concerns or weaknesses that hackers could use to access your devices or accounts. They can also add new features.



Turn on multi-factor authentication (MFA)

MFA means having more than one check in place to prove your identity on an account. For example, you may need a code from a text message and your passphrases. It makes it much harder for cybercriminals to access your accounts.



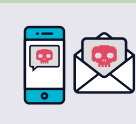
Set up and perform regular backups

A backup is a digital copy of your most important information either to an external storage device or a server on the internet like the cloud. It means you can restore your files if something goes wrong.



Set up secure passphrases

When MFA is not available, use a passphrase to secure your account. A passphrase is a strong type of password that uses four or more random words. This makes them hard for cybercriminals to guess but easy for you to remember.



Recognise and report scams

Criminals often use email, SMS, phone calls and social media to scam people. They usually do this by contacting you and pretending to be an individual or organisation you know and trust. Always be alert when clicking on attachments or links within emails or messages.



Level up your cyber security by...

- Thinking about what you post online.
- Signing up to our free alert service to receive alerts on new threats
- Talking about cyber security with your family and friends.
- Avoiding public Wi-Fi when you're banking or shopping online.
- Reporting cyber attacks and incidents to keep Australia secure.

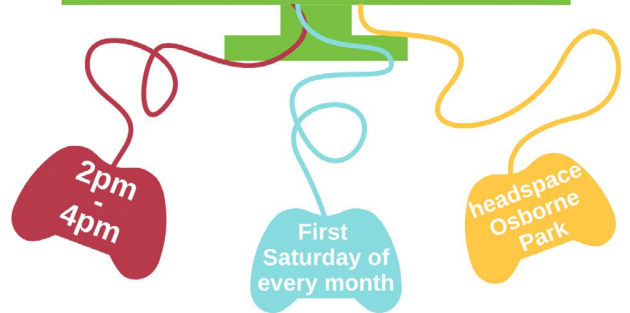
