The school has a focus on well-being and is using Positive Education from Geelong Grammar School to provide structure to the whole school change initiative.

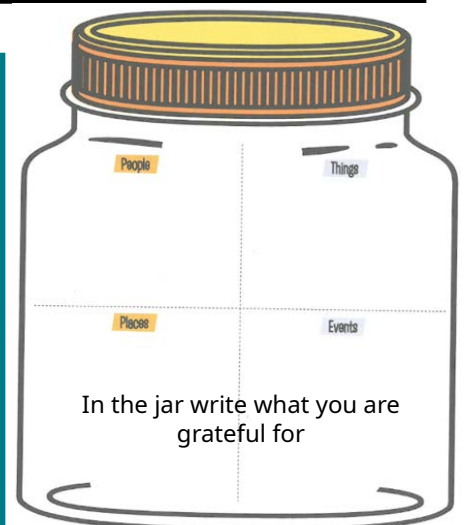
