Formative Assessment In Action

Year 7 AEP Science students recently combined creativity and content knowledge by designing double-sided bookmarks to demonstrate their understanding of the phases of the moon. As a form of formative assessment, students participated in a gallery walk where they reviewed each other's work, identified key features of effective communication, and gave feedback. This process supported reflection, clarified misconceptions, and guided improvements. Following the activity, the teacher guided a discussion on how visual tasks like this can support study and revision by helping students organise and retain key scientific ideas.







Career Taster - Year 9 and 10

Recently some Year 9 and 10s had the opportunity to attend a career taster for nursing and medic and the Health Science Hub in Perth. It was an amazing opportunity to learn firsthand what is required of medics and nurses, and the many different roles withing the healthcare field.

The students took part in many practical activites, including checking each other's vital signs and learning to use a spine board. It was an eye opening experience to see what goes into working as a medic/nurse. The students were grateful for the opportunity to experience and learn more about these career paths.




Aboriginal War Veterans Commemoration

On 28 May, students from Churchlands' Follow the Dream program participated in a ceremony to honour Indigenous

Veterans. The service is an annual event, but this one was special because it was the culmination of a shared project between Churchlands, Shenton, Carine, Mount Lawley, Duncraig, Ballajura, Belridge, and Warwick SHS to honour nine Aboriginal soldiers who had previously not been recognised. These soldiers were being honoured as part of Reconciliation Week.



The nine "forgotten soldiers" were Michael Connor, Augustus Pegg Farmer, Larry Farmer, Thomas Henry Ford, Stanley Hedley, William John Jackson, Charles Latwood, Henry Mason, and Edward Henry Rawson.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)



Every year, all schools in

Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).




