The Opus Concert is such an important event for us to contribute to, as it showcases the best of IMSS, and they provide most of our fabulous instrumental teachers. It's also a big opportunity to show the Education Department hierarchy the magic IMSS creates in schools.

The GATE Music camp was a glorious success at the end of the first week, with this team-building opportunity for our younger music specialists, as seen below.

Happily, our concert seasons and the band, orchestra, vocal, guitar, and jazz festivals were uninterrupted by the pandemic. We are trying a different approach to the video editing process and hope to have all three concerts available soon, even before the year is out. Thanks to the MPC for ensuring that the concerts run so smoothly and are a positive experience for our youngest musicians. We said farewell to Michelle Porteous and Dave Fudge for their many years of active membership supporting our students through the music parents' committee at the senior concert. They have each stamped their mark on the running of events at Churchlands, and I know their influence will be felt for a long time to come. The festivals continue to be a very positive experience for young musicians, and the format promotes a festive and collegiate atmosphere.

The pace of planning for next year's jubilee spectacular is increasing, with alumni signing up to be a part of the fun. My thanks to Kristel, Ursula, and Miranda for the time they have contributed to the planning so far. The first of our commissioned jubilee compositions have started to arrive, so next year's special event will feature exciting music composed for that very occasion. Our most senior students had their recital night, with a record number wanting to participate. It is an annual feature of our calendar and an opportunity for younger students to get a sense of the dizzying but achievable heights that lay ahead. It is a complex event to manage and is done with aplomb by Jess van de Ploeg. This was followed by the rescheduled Meet the Instrumental Teachers night, which didn't happen last year, and almost didn't happen this year! Thank you, Paul Sealey, for making sure it finally happened.

Our annual ensemble placement audition process had a Covid-proof makeover this year. Kristel Hawksworth and Caron Walker devised and implemented the new process. We are very happy with it as a first attempt at gathering and collating 500+ videos, and most students were able to manage the sharing process. It'll be videos again next year, but with a few tweaks and some streamlining.

Term 3 will finish at full speed, with our most senior instrumental students performing in a combined concert with the students from the UWA Conservatorium of Music for the Australian National Band & Orchestra Conference. It has been many years since Perth has hosted this very special event, and it's the chance to present our best young musicians on a national stage.

I want to thank the CSHS classroom music staff and the IMSS instrumental staff for their efforts this term, which feels like it was 15 weeks long. My particular thanks to Nikki Hills, who deals with any calamity or last-minute imposition with a smile before quickly and efficiently making the problems go away.
