

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Meet WACE Requirements



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Meet WACE Requirements

Breadth and Depth	Choose at least 1 course from List A and List B courses in Year 12
Literacy and Numeracy Requirements	Meet the Literacy and Numeracy standards through NAPLAN or OLNA as well as complete four units of English, two in Year 12.
Achievement Standard	Achieve a minimum of 14 C grades in Year 11 and 12 (or equivalents) including at least 6 C Grades in Year 12 Units (or equivalents).
Course / Endorsed Program Completion	Complete a minimum of 20 units (or equivalents) including a minimum of 10 Year 12 units (or equivalents). This includes sitting the Examinations invigilated by SCSA for all ATAR Courses.



WACE Examinations

- Compulsory for all Year 12 ATAR courses.
- Students sitting 4 or more WACE exams will obtain an ATAR.
- They start the 1st November

Current Graduation Rate?

- Based on Year 11 results and Year 12 Semester 1 results, we think the vast majority of Churchlands students will meet the WACE requirements at this stage. Completing all UOC for any Certificate courses is essential.
- We have given 43 students mentors to help them.
- WACE exams make the major contribution to the ATAR. A well-managed study and revision program will maximize these results!



Important Dates...

- Week 1 of Vacation – WACE Practical exams.
- Week 1 of Vacation – Subsidised revision programs with Academic Task Force (at Churchlands).
- Week 2 of Vacation – Revision programs with Mastermind WACE+ (at Hale).
- WACE exams start Monday 31 October. Churchlands has paid to have most exams on our site. Some such as Languages and Music will be held off site. Special exam arrangements will be held here at Churchlands. Last exams Friday 18 November.
- Saturday 19 November – Presentation Ceremony



Don't Lose Focus!

- We're at the "business end" of the season
- Students need to:
 1. Manage their time well. Adopt good stress management techniques e.g. Mindfulness
 2. Work hard and effectively (there's nearly 3 ½ months off between WACE exams and Uni starting – relax then, or get a Christmas job!!)



The Study Environment...

- A desk in the room works well (minimise clutter)
- Make sure the lighting is good (fluoro/led lamps)
- Comfortable chair (not too comfy though!!!)
- Minimise distractions (eg social media, mobile phones, radio, TV, ipods and other family members!)
- Make sure the temperature is not too hot and not too cold!!!

Time	Activity
4.00pm	Get home, have a snack
4.15pm	HW/Study
5.15pm	Shower
5.30pm	HW/Study
6.30pm	Dinner with family
7.00pm	HW/Study
8.00pm	Relax, fun stuff. Don't go to bed too late!



A few additional tips

- Plan the use of time – use the diary
- Think about each day and plan homework and study times around commitments and natural breaks
- Reduce paid work – not at all over school and WACE exams
- Negotiate a reduction in jobs around the house at critical times.



Scholarships and Incentives

- Don't forget to check out scholarships. Students have received lots of information from Clare Slodecki. Keep eyes and ears open. Check university websites.
- Many courses at Curtin – get ATAR of 96-96.99 get \$5000. If 97+ can get \$15000.
- Curtin 2 x \$1000 awards (school nomination)
- ECU Excellence award \$5000 per year (students apply)
- UWA Principal's Citizenship \$1500 (school nomination)
