





- Reading Plus/ Lexia
  - On-line Reading program that all students (Years 7-9) should complete as regular homework.
  - Subscriptions are paid as part of your purchase of textbooks for English.
  - Placed through testing and then undertake an individualised program to improve their:
    - Reading speed
    - Comprehension
    - Vocabulary
- Targeted Intervention to Improve Reading Skills
  - Students are identified prior to starting with us or in their English classes as needing support and are then placed in literacy support classes.

## **Academic Extension Program (AEP)**


- The Academic Extension Program caters for the unique needs of gifted and talented students through a combination of the following throughout junior and middle secondary school.

# Science Self-Evaluation after a quiz

## **English**Success Criteria in a Rubric

Character	Given the reader the few necessary details but I have spread them out in the story; the character is changed by the end of the story.	Given the reader some details about the character but focused on what's happening in the story.	Given the reader a lot of detail about the backstory of the main character.
After reading my short story, I can see that I have	Also used dialogue, actions and other characters to help the reader understand the main character. Plot Structure  After reading my short story, I can see that I have	Written a story with all parts of the plot structure and used a flashback or flashforward to develop the conflict.	Written a short story with an exposition, rising action, climax, falling action and a resolution.	Written a beginning, middle and end but some of it seems obvious, eg: woke up and it was all a dream or included a lot of the character's backstory.
	Resolved the conflict in an unexpected way.	Given the characters both internal and external conflict to overcome.	Given the characters a problem to overcome but there isn't much tension.
Setting  After reading my short story, I can see that I have	Zoomed in on specific details about the setting; e.g. Used sensory imagery to develop the setting, time of day/season, weather, etc	Used descriptive language to add detail to the setting. It is clear where and when the story takes place.	Constructed a vague setting – it's hard to tell when or where the story occurs. (The setting doesn't seem important to the story)  There is little / no sense of mood.
	The setting and mood fit the genre of the story.	Used verbs and adjectives to create the mood.
