

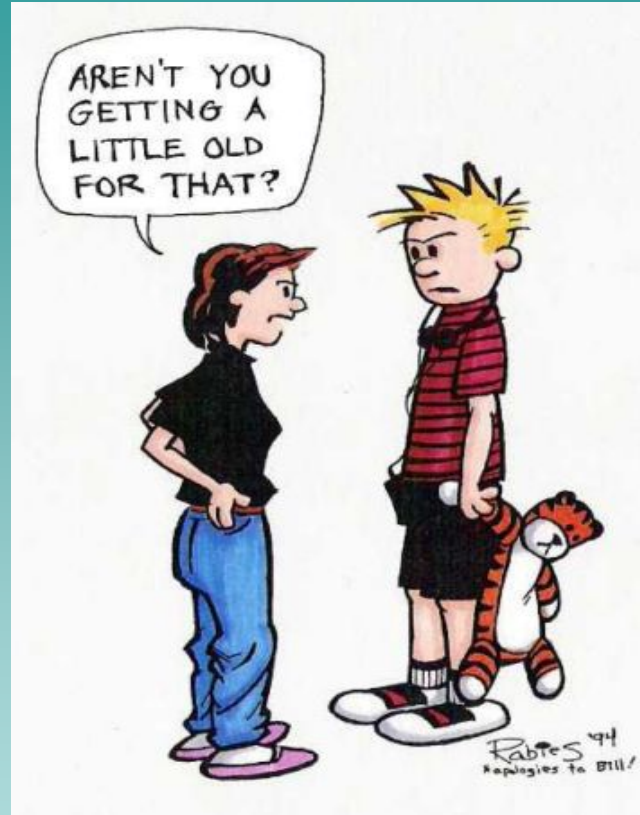

- Remember, last year students needed to apply for a Unique Student Identifier (USI). Will need this again for this year’s process.

Senior School Structure

Course types at Churchlands SHS:

- **ATAR courses** (need 4 or more to go to university – compulsory WACE exams)
- **General Courses** (for students aiming for further training or work – no exams but **externally set task** in Year 12)

VET Courses:

- **Certificate Courses** have unit equivalence
- **Workplace Learning** has unit equivalence

Senior School Structure

- ATAR and General courses are divided into units.
- Year 11 courses cover units 1 and 2.
- **Year 12 courses will cover units 3 and 4.**
- The program is taught as a year long course in each year.

So.....

- All our courses are year-long
- ATAR or General courses give credit for **two** units (units 3 and 4)
- A Certificate II fully completed is worth **four** units ($2 \times \text{Yr 11} + 2 \times \text{Yr12}$). If not fully completed then worth **ZERO** units!

WACE requirements

- Pathway direction
- Literacy and Numeracy
- Breadth and depth

- WACE Examinations

Pathway Direction

- Complete at least four Year 12 ATAR courses including the external examinations (i.e. be eligible for an ATAR)

or

- Complete at least five Year 12 General and/or ATAR courses or equivalent

(new this year)

or

- Complete a Certificate II or higher. (Can be in Year 11 or 12)

Literacy and Numeracy

- Achieve Band 8 or higher in Reading, Writing and Numeracy from Year 9 NAPLAN.

OR

- Pass the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA)
- **Students yet to pass an OLNA component must attend the regular preparation sessions.**
- OLNA held March and September of Year 10-12

Breadth and Depth

- Complete a **minimum of 20 units** or the equivalent.
- The 20 course units must include:
 - Two Year 11 and two Year 12 English units
 - One pair of Year 12 units from each of List A (arts/languages/social sciences) and List B (mathematics/science/technology)
 - Minimum 10 Year 12 units or equivalent

(NOTE: **maximum of 8 unit equivalents** from Certificate courses and WL can be **included in the 20 units**)

Achievement standard

- Achieve a minimum of 14 C grades or higher across Year 11 and Year 12 units (or equivalents) **including** at least 6 C grades in Year 12 units (or equivalents).

NOTE:

Completing a Cert II, for example, gives no grades but gives credit for 4 units.

Therefore would need 10 C grades with at least 4 in Year 12!

WACE Examinations 2021

- All ATAR courses have compulsory school exams as part of the assessment program.
- All General courses will include an EST (Externally Set Task) in Term 2. Set by SCSA, marked by the school.
- It is **COMPULSORY** for all students undertaking an ATAR course to sit the relevant WACE exam.
- Consequence....if a student doesn't sit the exam or try for it then the subject won't count for WACE.

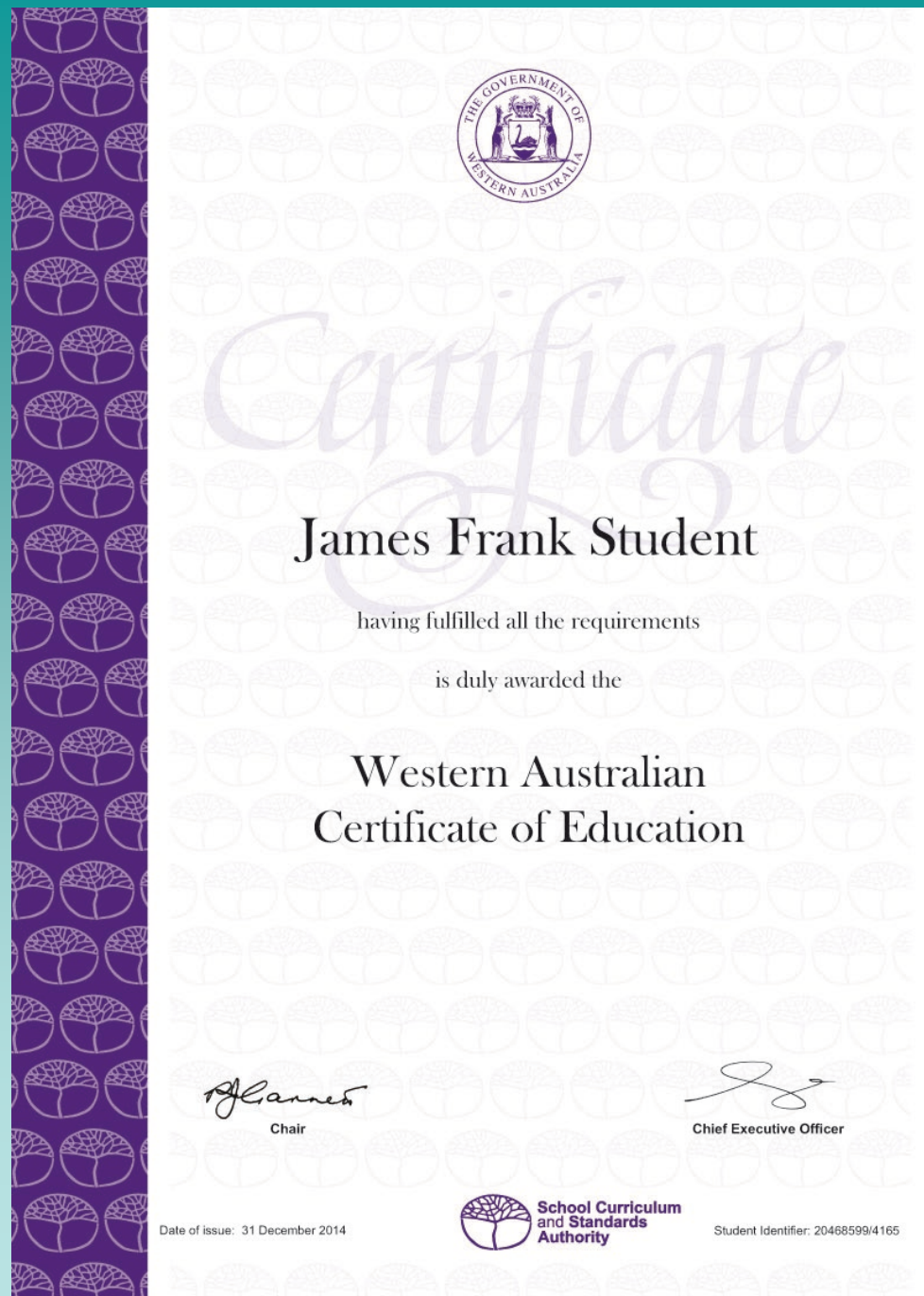


COMMUNITY SERVICE

SCALING IN WACE EXAMS

- * Some courses tend to go up
- * Some courses tend to go down

(Adjusted by SCSA at end of Year 12)



Major Processes

- **Moderation (SCSA)** – school marks are adjusted to even out differences in school marking standards. They are moderated against the raw WACE exam performance.
- **Combined Marks (SCSA)** – school marks and WACE exam marks are combined 50/50.
- **Scaling (TISC)** – effectively recognises that different courses have different levels of difficulty and this adjusts final marks accordingly.

Standardised or “adjusted” marks

At Churchlands we standardise the marks for all students in ATAR courses. This means that “raw” marks are adjusted based on both historical Churchlands data as well as the attributes of the relevant cohort. These are the marks that we submit to SCSA and print on reports.

It shows the likely scaled score at the end of the Year 12 course if working at the same level.

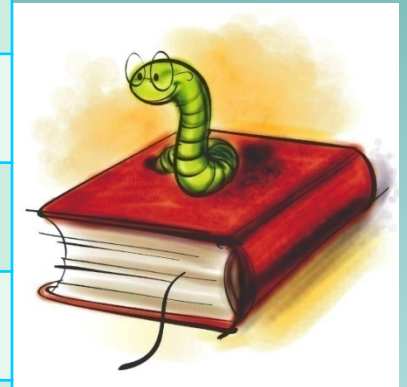
ATAR – Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank

- At the end of Year 12, top 4 scaled scores + 10% of best **language** + 10% of **Maths Methods** score + 10% of **Maths Specialist** score added together to give mark out of 430.
(TEA)
- Possible to sit a language not offered at Churchlands as a “non-school candidate” in Year 12 which allows you to get the **“BONUS”!**
- The scores sorted in order and a rank applied (ATAR)
- An ATAR of 90 means a student is better than 90% of all the Year 12 school leaving age people in WA . They are therefore in the top 10%.
- ATARs are equivalent with other states’ ranks

Example – The Language Bonus

- Maths Applications 71
 - English 64
 - Modern History 72
 - French 50
 - Chemistry 73
-
- Best four course total = $73 + 72 + 71 + 64 = 280$
 - 10% of French mark is included so TEA would become $73 + 72 + 71 + 64 + 5 = 285$
 - Last year this produced an ATAR of 91.45, the Language does not need to be in the top 4 courses. (It boosted the ATAR by 1.05 in this example!)

Choosing a Language

Languages offered at Churchlands:

- Chinese Second Language
- French Second Language
- Japanese Second Language

- Must apply using forms available from SCSA or language teachers.
- Deadline 28 August to SCSA

Other Languages...

- Many students are fluent in another language other than the ones offered at school.
- In Year 12 it is possible to enrol as a “non-school candidate” in these languages (often following an Eastern States syllabus) and sit the WACE exam.
- You receive no “grade” but the “mark” counts towards the ATAR.

Will let students know details Term 1, 2021

Example with Maths and Language

- Physics 83
- Maths Methods 80
- Literature 75
- Chemistry 72
- Maths Specialist 60
- Spanish (private) 40

Best four course total = $83+80+75+72=310$ (ATAR 95.7)

Plus 3 x bonuses = $310+8+6+4=328$ (ATAR 97.5)

Which gives an ATAR boost of 1.8

- **NOTE: Can't include both Apps and Methods OR Apps and Spec in calculation of the ATAR. (Can do Methods and Spec)**

YEAR LONG COURSES

- Years 11 and 12 courses (ATAR and General) are offered as a pair of units which are treated as year long courses. **THERE WILL BE NO STUDENT INITIATED COURSE CHANGES AFTER WEEK 5.**
- The school and parent can initiate subject changes after this only due to performance issues only.
- **After the SCSA deadline in around Week 8 of Term 1 there are NO MORE SUBJECT CHANGES, YOU CAN'T CHANGE TO DIFFERENT SUBJECTS IN SEMESTER 2.**
- End of year exams for ATAR courses cover the years work!
- Final grade and % awarded to a student at the end of the year will be submitted to SCSA for both semester units.
- Semester 1 grade and mark provided in the first semester report will be an **interim result only**.

(Year 11 going into Year 12)

The Subject Selection process is an important component of the successful completion of Senior School studies leading to the achievement of the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and transition to tertiary education, further training or employment. It is best to try to get the subject choices right at this point, rather than making changes after the academic year has started. Students should have been working through a range of support materials aimed at providing them with the appropriate understanding to make informed decisions about their future. If students are clearly not coping with an ATAR subject in Year 11, it is generally unwise to try to pick that subject for Year 12. It is essential that both parents and students work together to complete this process.

Please ensure that all relevant steps of the SSO are completed.

The recommended subjects for all students have been embedded within SSO. They have been based upon prerequisites reflecting historical data and the performance of all students. Past performance is the best indicator of future success. We strongly recommend that decisions are based on these recommendations. Where a subject is requested against recommendation, parents and students MAY be given the option to email the Head of Learning Area (HOLA) from within SSO presenting relevant evidence. It will also be possible for parents to book an appointment with a counsellor to complete the selection process if further assistance is required.

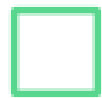



SELECTING COURSES

- **Be realistic**
- **Need a minimum “C” grade to select follow on course, sometimes higher – check handbook.**
- **Maximum of 4 units from any course can count towards WACE.**
- **Do research on courses**
- **Listen to the advice of teachers**

Should achieve a C or better in at least 2 courses to proceed to Year 12

Selecting a Pathway

Every student must either generate an ATAR, complete a minimum of 5 graded subjects or complete a Certificate II course or higher.

An ATAR requires a minimum of at least 4 Tertiary Stream courses. Your ATAR prediction from Year 11 should be 65 or more for realistic chance of University entry by “front door method (70)”.

Will I get what I want?

- Most students get their selection
- If not, then generally two courses occur at the same time or the course has been cancelled
- Pre-requisites are important.
- If a student meets the pre-requisite by the end of the year they may be able to select the course then.



Can I Change?

- The earlier the better (student initiated changes finished by end Week 5)
- Rigorous Testing over first 6 weeks
- School initiated changes for students at risk finish towards the end of Term 1 (SCSA sets the date).
- Restricted choices
 - some classes may be full
 - choices must fit the timetable
- You will need to catch up on assessments
Up to 6 courses + weeks missed
