




- The subject selection process is both an exciting and challenging part of your child's education journey.

- are their choice and not the choice of others!



Welcome to Subject Selection Online for Year 11 2022.

The Subject Selection process is an important component of the successful completion of Senior Secondary studies leading to the achievement of the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) and transition to tertiary education, further training or employment. It is best to try to get the subject choices right at this point, rather than making changes after the academic year has started.

Students have been working through a range of support materials aimed at providing them with the appropriate understanding to make informed decisions about their future. It is essential that both parents and students work together to complete this process.

Please ensure that all relevant steps of the SSO are completed. If you have sent a request to a Head of Learning, you will need to log back in to complete your selection once your request has been considered.

The recommended subjects for all students have been embedded within SSO. Past performance is the best indicator of future success. We strongly recommend that decisions are based on these recommendations. Where a subject is requested against recommendation, parents and students MAY be given the option to email the Head of Learning Area (HOLA) from within SSO presenting relevant evidence. It will also be possible for parents to book an appointment with a counsellor to complete the selection process if further assistance is required.






REQUESTING AN OVERRIDE

Should you require assistance in completing the Subject Selections, you will have the ability to book that through SSO




COURSE COUNSELLOR MEETINGS
